Task

During the Covid 19 pandemic all types of engineering companies, including automotive, aircraft and medical, have been affected. The future of some engineering companies is uncertain, and many companies have had to furlough their workers and are relying on the Government's support to get them through this difficult time.

We would like you to conduct research to determine 'How the engineering/manufacturing sector responded to the Coronavirus crisis'

We would like you to think about:

- How businesses adapted to the Government's call for the manufacturing industry to help manufacture PPE (Personal Protective Equipment).
- Companies have had to change working environments to maintain social distancing.
- Have people at home or in small groups with access to 3D printers made an impact manufacturing PPE?

These are just some points to consider - you can think of your own too!

Your research should then be constructed into a written piece that responds to the topic outlined above.

It should be approximately two pages, in font size 12 and can include images/graphs and comments taken from relevant websites.

Do not forget that you can read documents, newspapers, watch TV and listen to the radio – not all research needs to be carried out on the internet.
